TWO RAVENSTHORPE "PALS" KILLED

Official information was received on Teesday of the deaths of two life-long Havensthorpe pals, Pte. Like Clegr Leadbeater (19), son of Mrs. Rowbottom, Huddersheld Road: and Pte. George Arthur Ledgard (19), son of Mr. and Mrs. John Ledgard, 549, Pophar Terrace. Both attended the Havensthorpe United Methodist Church and Sunday School, and both were employed at Messrs. Jas. Smith and Sons, dyers and dry cleaners, Leadbeater as a glazer, and Ledgard as a wet cleaner. The only news to hand about Ledgard is that he was killed in action on the 21st November, in the great battle on the Combrid front. He was attached to the West Yorkshire Regiment, and had been in France aine

months. He joined the Colours on the 18th October, 1916. His last letter was written on November 17th, and he stated that he was going up the lines again, and that he was an officer's servant. His father is a deputy at the Mirheld Colliery Commany's Cakler Road Pit.

18th Luke Clerk Lendbeater, joined the Duke

It's Luke Clerr Leadheater, joined the Duke of Wellington's Regiment and trained chiefly at Chelmsford. He went to France on October 11th this year. Second-Lieut. R. B. Atthison writes to Mrs. Rowbottom:—"It is with the very deepest regret that I have to inform you of the death of Pte. L. C. Leadbeater. It will be a great comfort and consolation for you to know that he suffered no pain, and that death was imstantanceous. He had not been long with us, but he had shown great premise, and was always cheerful. His behaviour was all that could be desired. Please accept the very deepest sympathy of all the officers and men of the Cempany in your sad less, and also my own, as plateou commander, for I admired his conduct very much. He was buried by the Church of England Chaplain, and a photograph of his grave may be had."
