
DEWSBURY SACRIFICES



LOCAL HORSEKEEPER KILLED IN ACTION

The sad news has only just come through of the death in action on October 3rd of Private Albert Heald (20). K.O.Y.L.I., son of Mr. and Mrs. A. E. Heald, 7, Webster Street, Dewsbury. An old boy of Dewsbury Parish Church School, he had been with the Forces about two years, prior to which he was employed by Messrs. Crawshaw and Warburton, Ltd., as assistant horsekeeper. A brother, Driver Harry Heald, is serving with the R.F.A., and a brother-in-law, Private A. Buckley, H.L.I., is in Mesopotamia. SON OF A SOLDIER FATHER KILLED.

Mrs. Charles Adcock, 32, Back Cliffe Street, Dewsbury, has received the sad news of the death of her son, Pte. Charles Adcock, West Yorks. Regiment, in France, on August 13th. She heard last week from the Infantry Records Office that he had been gassed and wounded, and that his condition did not permit of his being visited. The day following she was notified that he had passed away. He joined up at 17 1/2 years of age, on May 11th, 1917, but was not ordered to France until last spring. His father, Corp. Charles Adcock, West Riding Regiment, has been in the Army since September 1914. The family belong to Norfolk, but they came to Dewsbury seven years ago, and the deceased soldier attended the Eastborough Council School and the Out-and-Out Mission, and at one time he was a member of the Ebenezer Boys' Brigade. He was a hurrier at Messrs. Crawshaw and Warburton's Shaw Cross pit, and his father was a teacher for Mr. W. R. Thompson.
