Dewsbury Young Man Dies After Being Discharged

The death occurred on Monday, six months after being discharged from the Army, of Mr. Luther Roebuck (31), son of Mr. Heber Roebuck, a former flock merchant, of Batley Carr, who now resides at 6, Mill Road, Batley Carr. He joined the Forces in March, 1917, and went to France last July. He was badly wounded in the head in August, and was discharged last December, after a very serious operation. Since then, though he always wore a head bandage, he had appeared fairly well, until on Sunday he was taken suddenly ill. He died the following day. The interment took place at Dewsbury Cemetery on Wednesday.

The deceased was very well known in Dewsbury. From leaving school he had been employed by Mr. J. Jubbs, clothier, and before joining up he was manager of the shop at the Corporation Street end of the Arcade. He was a member of Dewsbury Liberal Club.
