Soldier Chorister's Fate
Private Joseph Haigh, Durham Light Infantry, son of Mrs. Wm. Haigh, Whitley Lower, is officially presumed to have died on or since March 21st, 1918, on which date he was posted as missing.
Before joining the Forces in April, 1917, Private Haigh was employed as a night piecer by Messrs. Rawden Briggs and Co., Ravens-thorpe. He was an old boy of Whitley Lower C.E. Schools, and a former chorister at Whit-lely Church.

THORNHILL OFFICER KILLED.
NEWS RECEIVED ON ARMISTICE DAY.
On the day of the signing of the armistice, official notification was received by Mr. and Mrs. Hinchliffe, of Whitley Road, Thornhill, of the death in action, on November 4th, of their son, Second-Lieut. F. B. Hinchliffe (26), Duke of Wellington's West Riding Regiment. Second-Lieut. Hinchliffe enlisted as a private in September, 1915, and in July of this year obtained a commission for which he had trained at New College, Oxford. He was over on leave as late as October. As a boy he attended Whitley C.E. School, later the Wheelwright Grammar School, and finally the South Wales Training College, Carmarthen. He took up teaching as a profession and on enlistment was an assistant teacher at the Boothroyd Lane School. He attended Whitley Church.

BRIESTFIELD SOLDIER KILLED IN ACTION.
News has come to hand of the death in action on October 28th of Signaller William Wright, (21), of the West Yorkshire Regiment. Signaller Wright lived with Mr. and Mrs. Henry Watson, of Ivy Cottage, Bristfield, and previous to enlisting, in May, 1915, worked at Messrs. Jaggar's Grange Ash Collieries, Grange Moor. It is a rather sad coincidence that Signaller Wright had got his pass for a leave the same day he was killed. He had been wounded three times previously. Before joining up he attended the Bristfield Wesleyan Sunday School.
