

Harry was born in Earlsheaton on 8th December 1878 and baptised at All Saints Church, Dewsbury on 12th October 1879. His father was John Wheatley, a Monumental Mason born in Hyde, Cheshire in 1848 and died in 1897. His mother was Margaret (nee Halstead) born in Whitley Upper near Kirkheaton in 1848 and died in 1906. They were married on 6th November 1869 at St. James Church, Flockton.

Their other children were; William, born in 1869 and died in 1878, Eliza Ann, born in 1871, Fred, born in 1874 and died in 1878, Clara, born in 1876, Sarah, born in 1881, James, born in 1883 and Thomas, born in 1885.

On the 1871 Census the family lived at Hill End, Earlsheaton, in 1881 at Wakefield Old Road, in 1891, 1901 and 1911 at 26, South Terrace, Old Bank Road, Dewsbury.

Harry was a single man who was educated at Eastborough Council School, and worked as a Sugar Boiler at a Confectionary Works, probably Messrs Slade and Bullock, Excelsior Works, Bradford Street, Dewsbury, the company credited with inventing lettered rock.

He enlisted in Dewsbury in December 1915 into the 2nd/4th King's Own Yorkshire Light Infantry with the Service Numbers 5241 and later 202340. He served in the United Kingdom from 22nd March 1916 to 15th January 1917 and then on the Western Front from 16th January 1917 to 6th April 1918 and again in the United Kingdom from 7th April 1918 to 20th March 1919 when he was discharged with the disability of Trench Fever attributable to military service, and was awarded a pension. He died on 4th April 1919 at his home at 26, Old Bank Road, Earlsheaton from Valvular Heart Disease and Heart Failure. He was buried in Earlsheaton Cemetery. Harry was awarded the British War Medal and the Victory Medal.

Harry is commemorated on the Dewsbury Cenotaph in Crow Nest Park and in the Dewsbury Roll of Honour kept in Dewsbury Central Library and on the Earlsheaton Park War Memorial and on the Memorial Plaque to former pupils at Eastborough Council School.


