### HANGING HEATON SOLDIER KILLED.

Another name has to be added to the roll of Hanging Heaton's honoured dead. We refer to the late Pte. Joseph Bailey, Duke of Wellington's Regiment, of 12, Owl Lane. The soldier's mother has received kind and sympathetic letters from a second-lieutenant and from some of his old comrades. We gather from these letters that Pte. Bailey was fatally shot as he and his comrades were leaving the trenches. He was formerly an old scholar of the Hanging Heaton Parish Church.

### Popular Hanging Heaton Soldier Shot Through the Lungs

A well-known Hanging Heaton soldier, Pte. Frank Collinson (24), London Regiment, son of Mr. and Mrs. Digby Collinson, Chidswell Lane, Dewsbury, is reported killed. His Lieutenants writes:—"He was shot through the lungs today (September 4th), and died immediately. He was buried by our Padre. He was a very good fellow, and a great favourite, and his loss will be very keenly felt by all of us."

Enlisting in November, 1914, Pte. Collinson had a varied Army career. From France he was transferred to Salonika, and from there to Palestine, and he was wounded at Beersheba. He returned to France after two years in the Holy Land, and was on leave a month ago. An old boy of Hanging Heaton Church Day Schools, he was also connected with the Parish Church, and a former choir boy. Before enlisting he was employed by Messrs. Joseph Wilson and Sons, clothing manufacturers, Batley Carr. His eldest brother, Willie, is in France, and his younger brother, Leonard, is serving in India.

### HANGING HEATON SOLDIER'S DEATH. ONE OF THREE BROTHERS KILLED.

Official notification of the death in action of Pte. Harry Richardson, West Yorkshire Regiment, has been received by his parents, Mr. and Mrs. A. Richardson, 3, Bromley Road, Hanging Heaton. Pte. Richardson, who lived with his parents, was 21 years of age, and before enlisting worked as a warper. He enlisted over two years ago, and went to France in January of this year. He was educated at Hanging Heaton C.E. School, and attended Hanging Heaton Church. He was also a Reebbite. He has two brothers serving, their names being Pte. Walter Richardson and Pte. Sam Richardson.

### DEWSBURY LEWIS GUNNER KILLED.

We regret to announce the death of another Dewsbury soldier in the person of Pte. Sam Senior (38), East Kents., son of Mr. and Mrs. Charles Henry Senior, of Glenmount, top of Leeds Road, Dewsbury. Pte. Senior joined up on August 29th, 1916, and went to France in September, 1917. His platoon commander writes of him: "I am his platoon commander, and in him I have lost one of my best Lewis gunners. He was a fine fellow and admired by us all. The boy's death was instantaneous, as a shell burst close to him, several of his comrades paying the same price." Before joining the Army, Pte. Senior was employed by F. and T. Mitchell, plumbers, Savile Town. He was connected with the Ebenezer Chapel and Sunday School, Hanging Heaton.
